

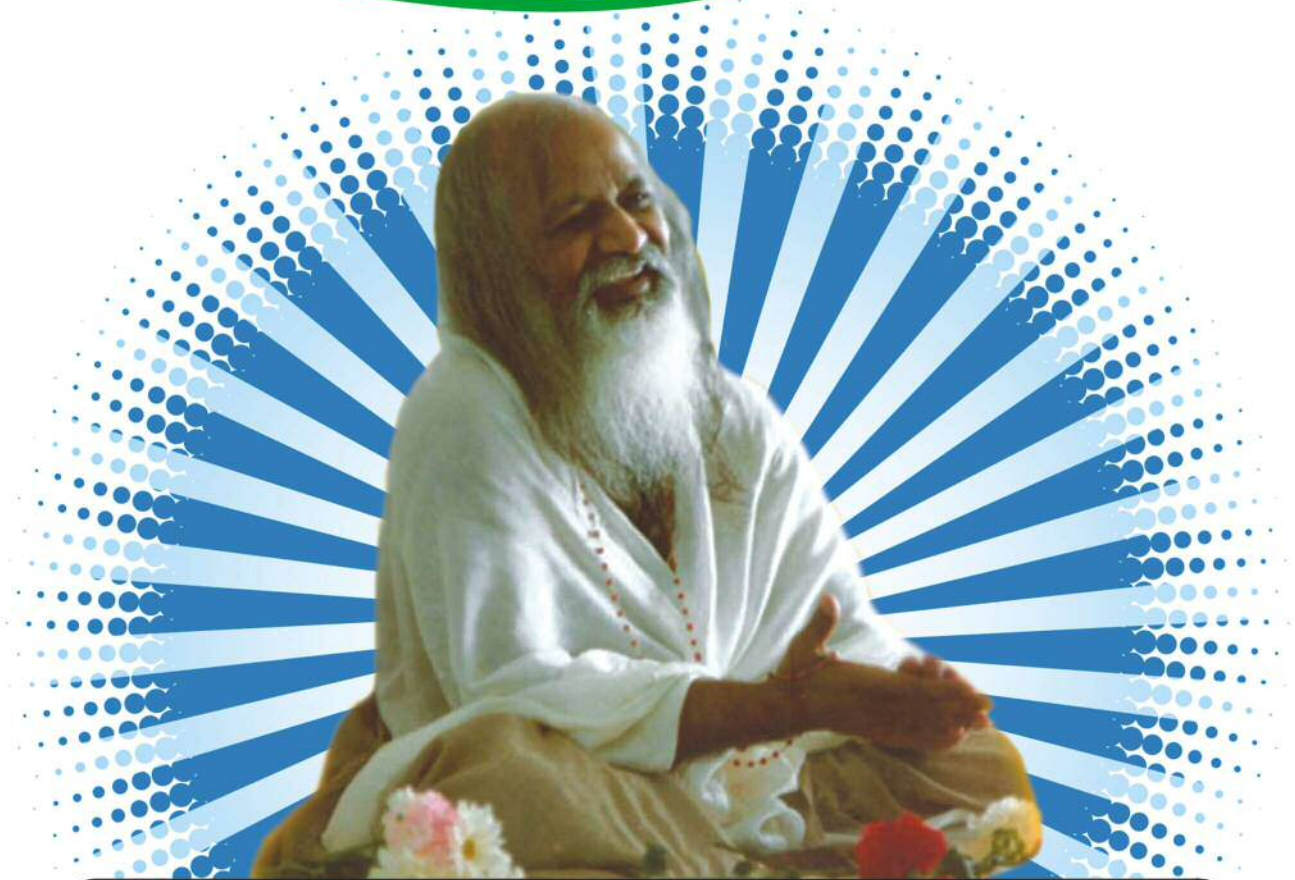

- ☐ School will make arrangement for hair cut if children (boys) come with long hair.

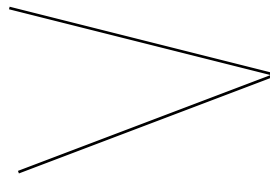
